

March 3, 2016

The Taylor County Board of Supervisors met in regular session, with Jerry Murphy, Charles Ambrose, Doug Horton and County Auditor Bonny Baker present.

After roll call the Board approved the agenda for today's meeting and the minutes of the last meeting.

Bill Huey from Prochaska and Associates met with the Board. The Board signed off on the Taylor County Certificate of Substantial Completion on the Law Enforcement Center Project.

A motion was made by Murphy and seconded by Ambrose to cancel the following warrants:

The motion carried 3-0.

The Board approved the health insurance pay-out for Cindy Nally and Dani Gray.

A discussion was held about a claim for \$250 to be filed through the EMS Grant for a person living outside the county. A motion was made by Murphy and seconded by Ambrose to not approve filing for this expense. The motion carried 3-0. Discussion was also held on changing the grant to transfer money from the training line item to the data collection line. The Board agreed not to change the EMS Grant at this time.

Bonnie Godden met with the Board to inform them that the meals for the Bedford Meal Site will be catered starting July 1, 2016 from Valley Services from Greenfield.

Rob Wilson met with the Board in regard to the Across the Border Motorcycle Rally. Wilson would like permission to block off road by the fairgrounds for stunt riders if it is too wet to put on the show at the fairgrounds.

Lawn mowing at the Law Enforcement Center was discussed. Murphy and Horton will get prices on mowers and weed eaters.

The Board reviewed the county's monthly expense reports.

County Engineer Eldon Rike and Jim Rowe met with the Board. The Board set March 21, 2016 at 11:00 a.m. for a bid letting for Project No: LFM-CO87(1)-87-PCC Pavement. This is construction of PCC pavement 27' wide x 8" thick for Justice Street in front of the Law Enforcement Center.

Jim Rowe said Rob Wilson had discussed the possibility of blocking off the road in front of the fairgrounds with him. Rowe thought things could be worked out so if there was a need that it could be done.

No further business came before the Board at this time and the meeting adjourned subject to call.
