The Taylor County Board of Supervisors met in regular session, with Jerry Murphy, Charles Ambrose, Doug Horton and County Auditor Bonny Baker present.

After roll call the Board approved the agenda for today's meeting and the minutes of the last meeting.

Chairman Doug Horton open the public hearing on Floodplain Management Ordinance #34. The purpose of this ordinance is to protect and preserve the rights, privileges and property of Taylor County and its residents and to preserve and improve the peace, safety, health, welfare, and comfort and convenience of its residents by minimizing those flood losses described in Section 1(B) (1) of this ordinance. No one from the public was present. There were no written or oral objections received. The first reading of the ordinance was held. A motion was made by Ambrose and seconded by Murphy to close the public hearing. The motion carried 3-0. A motion was made by Murphy and seconded by Ambrose to suspend the second and third readings of the ordinance. The motion carried 3-0. A motion was made by Ambrose and seconded by Murphy to adopt Floodplain Management Ordinance #34 and publish the complete Ordinance in both official papers on March 23, 2016.

The Board received quotes from Sleep LLC, Agrivision and Lincoln Lawn Care for a mower for the Law Enforcement Center. Discussion was held on the different types of mowers. A motion was made by Ambrose and seconded by Murphy to purchase a Ferris 700Z mower with a 52" deck for \$4,700.00 from Sleep's LLC and a weed eater from Agrivision. The motion carried 3-0.

Jim Rowe visited with the Board in regard to road concerns.

No further business came before the Board at this time and the meeting adjourned subject to call.
