The Taylor County Board of Supervisors met in regular session with Doug Horton, Charles Ambrose, Jerry Murphy and County Auditor Bethany Murphy present.

After roll call the Board approved the agenda for today's meeting and the minutes for the last meeting.

The Board approved a handwritten warrant for Secondary Roads in the amount of \$250.00. The Board did not pay the Iowa County Attorney Association \$321.00 as the fee had already been paid.

Ambrose made a motion seconded by Murphy to accept the bid for \$30,230.00 from Andrew Tuckpointing for the south side of the Courthouse.

Chairman Doug Horton opened the public hearing on the amendments to the Floodplain Management Ordinance #34. The purpose of this ordinance is to protect and preserve the rights, privileges and property of Taylor County and its residents and to preserve and improve the peace, safety, health, welfare, and comfort and convenience of its residents by minimizing those flood losses described in Section 1(B) (1) of this ordinance. No one from the public was present. There were no written or oral objections received. The first reading of the ordinance was held. A motion Murphy and seconded by Ambrose to close the public hearing. Motion carried 3-0. A motion was made by Ambrose and seconded by Murphy to adopt the amendments to the Floodplain Management Ordinance #34. Motion carried 3-0. The amendments were published in both official papers on April 3.

Joan Gallagher and Mick Ware addressed the Board about a new radio system for Public Health.

Eldon Rike, Jim Rowe, and Randy Peterman joined the meeting. Jim presented a bid from Whipp Sales and Service for a Kabota Tractor for 77,300.00 and a Schulte 15' mower for \$21,400.00.

No further business came before the Board at this time and the meeting adjourned subject to call.
