

February 25, 2016

The Taylor County Board of Supervisors met in regular session, with Jerry Murphy, Charles Ambrose, Doug Horton and County Auditor Bonny Baker present.

After roll call the Board approved the agenda for today's meeting and the minutes of the last meeting.

Ambrose gave a report on the Taylor County Multi-jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan meeting he attended. There will be three public meetings with the kickoff meeting scheduled for March 24th at 5:30 at the Bedford Fire Station. The Emergency Management Board has hired a consultant, Amec Foster Wheeler Environment & Infrastructure, Inc. to manage the planning of this project.

A motion was made by Murphy and seconded by Ambrose to designate the Taylor County Public Health Agency as a county-designated public health agency. The motion carried 3-0.

The Board approved the "Equipment Disposal Forms" for the public health agency for a shredder and file cabinet.

The Board reviewed the county budget with Colleen Larimer, Bedford Times Press.

The Board approved the claims against Taylor County as listed in the "Publishing Claims List" dated February 25, 2016.

County Attorney Clint Spurrier reviewed the county's personnel policy with the Board. Spurrier will make the final changes and the Board will approve on Monday. Spurrier also discussed the Floodplain Management Ordinance with the Board. The Board set March 14th at 10:00 a.m. for a public hearing on the adoption of this ordinance.

No further business came before the Board at this time and the meeting adjourned subject to call.
