

January 5, 2015

The Taylor County Board of Supervisors met in regular session with Doug Horton, Jerry Murphy, Charles Ambrose and County Auditor Bonny Baker present.

After roll call the Board approved the agenda for today's meeting and the minutes of the last meeting.

Auditor Baker gave the December 29, 2014 Compensation Board minutes to the Board. The Compensation Board recommended 3% across the board to all elected officials and for longevity for elected officers at the rate per the county's personnel policy. No action was taken at this time.

The Board was given a copy of all expenses and revenue for the Preschool Building to review. The Board notified Sandra Donaldson in regard to meeting with the Preschool Board to discuss the expenses of the Preschool.

The Board reviewed December's Month End Expense Reports for the county.

Angela Green met with the Board in regard to National Radon Action Month. Radon is a colorless, odorless, naturally occurring gas that threatens the health of our citizens. Taylor County and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency are supporting efforts to encourage Americans to test their home for radon, mitigate elevated levels, and build new homes with radon-resistant methods. The Taylor County Board of Supervisors, do hereby proclaim the month of January 2015 as "Official Radon Action Month".

The Board approved the claims against Taylor County as listed in the "Publication Claim List" dated January 5, 2015.

The Board appointed Rick Nelson from Sharpsburg to fill the unexpired term of Ed Meek to the Veterans Affairs Board.

Jim Rowe met with the Board and asked if the credit card for secondary road had been approved. Baker thought Belinda Ogle was applying for the credit card. Rowe will start the process.

County Engineer Eldon Rike met with the Board. He reported that Ringgold County reported that the State Bridge Program application was approved by the state for replacement of the P14 high truss bridge north of Blockton. The award should be in the \$1.3M ballpark, leaving the balance to be filled by HBP funding.

No further business came before the Board at this time and the meeting adjourned subject to call.
