The Taylor County Board of Supervisors met in regular session, with Doug Horton, Jerry Murphy, Charles Ambrose and County Auditor Bonny Baker present.

After roll call the Board approved the agenda for today's meeting and the minutes of the last meeting.

Kevin Cabbage from Farmers Mutual Telephone Company, Josh Weed and Martin Jones met with the Board in regard to fiber optic going out to the Law Enforcement Center. Farmers Mutual will be submitting a bid for this service.

Weed explained that he knows a company that will update the jail policies for \$2,500 to update the jail policies. The Board approved for Weed to start the process of updating the policies to be paid from the general basic fund.

Richard Williamson met with the Board in regard to mowing the property at 805 Home Ave. in Lenox again this year. Taylor County has sold some of the lots and will be putting the mowing up for bids. The deadline for the auditor to receive bids will be April 3rd.

Auditor Baker attended a meeting with Bill Peterson from Iowa State Association of Counties in regard to Taylor County's unemployment insurance that Taylor County has with ISAC. Taylor County will receive a refund check for \$31,660.95 that will be deposited in the general supplemental fund.

The Board approved the claim to E.L. Crawford for \$212,325.00.

The Board approved the health insurance pay-out for Cindy Nally and Joan Gallagher.

A motion was made by Horton and seconded by Murphy to approve the new applications for family farm credit for fiscal year 2016. The motion carried 3-0.

County Engineer Eldon Rike met with the Board. A motion was made by Murphy and seconded by Horton to approve the Supplemental Agreement No. 1 for final design services for county bridge No. Holt 4 over Rose Branch FHWA No. 323700, Project No. BROS-CO87(51)—8J-87, Section 4, T70N, R34W, CB&A No. 2012219. Calhoun-Burns and Associates, Inc. propose to perform the design work for \$14,710. The motion carried 3-0.

The Board approved the "Equipment Disposal Form" for the public health department for an old fax machine and a HP jet printer.

No further business came before the Board at this time and the meeting adjourned subject to call.
