The Taylor County Board of Supervisors met in regular session, with Jerry Murphy, Doug Horton, Charles Ambrose and County Auditor Bonny Baker present.

After roll call the Board approved the agenda for today's meeting and the minutes of the last meeting.

Joan Gallagher informed the Board that their branch office in Corning is open now and they are having an open house on November 8th at the Wellness Center.

Horton gave a report on the landfill meeting he attended last night.

Sheriff Josh Weed asked about what fund the balance of his software should be paid from. It was decided that 50% would be paid from the Forfeited Fund and the remainder from the Bedford/Lenox Law Enforcement Fund.

County Attorney Clint Spurrier, County Engineer Eldon Rike, and Jim Rowe were present for the discussion on Wind Turbines with Randy Caviness. Caviness is working with General Electric to bring two wind turbines to Taylor County to the Clearfield area two miles south on Highway 25. Taylor County does not have zoning in the unincorporated area and does not have any control in this area. Caviness will apply for the trip permits.

The Board approved the following "Application for use of Road Right of Way for Utilities Accommodation": Lenox Municipal Utilities, Section 20 & 21 in Platte Township and for MidAmerican Energy, Section 21.

The Board approved the following claims: Gus Construction for \$15,752.50 for BROS-CO87(51)8J-87 and Murphy Heavy Contracting for \$137,713.64 for BROS-CO87(50)-8J-87.

No further business came before the Board at this time and the meeting adjourned subject to call.
